RUSSIAN SHIP SUNK

The Russian landing ship attacked by Ukrainian forces this week at in the southern port city of Berdyansk has sunk, Pentagon officials confirmed on Friday. Satellite images provided to USNI News by Maxar Technologies prove the Alligator-class landing ship tank (LST) that was seen on video on Thursday was underwater at the side of the pier, with the superstructure and forecastle sticking up above the water.

The imagery shows that the fire spread to a merchant ship moored in front of it. It appears that the merchant ship, likely a grain carrier, had been docked there since

before the invasion. The fire also spread to tanks on the pier. Both of these fires were still burning today when the satellite passed.

Video footage of the burning ship, taken soon after the attack, shows that two Ropucha-class landing ships were also damaged. They had been berthed alongside and in front of the Alligator-class amphibious ship. They sailed away fighting their own blazes as the fire on the Alligator raged.

A senior U.S. defence official confirmed to reporters on Friday that Ukrainian forces had struck and destroyed the Alligator-class LST while it was berthed in Berdyansk.

Back to Tahiti

But what of Bligh? There was still support for breadfruit to be transported to the West Indies from Tahiti and a ship was provided to do just that. She was a new build 107-foot sloop HMS *Providence*, 420 tons. Her captain was to be one Captain William Bligh. His orders were to include 'making a complete examination of the Torres Strait' (between the top of New Holland and the southern point of New Guinea). But what would this achieve for England? If a safe route were to be discovered it would provide a shortcut for ships returning to England from the Pacific and the penal colonies in new Holland. Bligh was provided a support vessel, the brig *Assistant*.

Providence's size allowed for a marine detachment. Bligh was to have the support of a lieutenant, a sergeant, two corporals, a drummer and fifteen marines on his voyage. Also, in his ship's company were to be sailmaker Lawrence Lebogue and steward John Smith, both of whom were with him in the Bounty.

3 Aug 1791. HMS *Providence* and *Assistant* sail Spithead for Tahiti, 25 days before *Pandora* founders on the Gt Barrier Reef.

28 Aug 1791. *Providence* and *Assistant* anchor Tenerife. Bligh is sick with a fever compounded by severe headaches.

About 4 Sept. The ships sail Tenerife, Bligh is still severely ill and bedridden. Lt. Portlock takes charge of the expedition.

By the time the ships reach Cape Town, Bligh's health has improved and he is again in command. However, while at sea the quartermaster John Letby was flogged for refusing to obey orders and assault on the bosun's mate (30 lashes)

The ships remain in Cape Town for two months.

23 Dec 1791. Bligh sails for Van Dieman's Land (Tasmania). The voyage was to take about seven weeks. Two weeks later, and only after surveying around Storm Bay and the Tasman Peninsula areas, Bligh sailed for Tahiti. During the voyage Bligh was to continue to suffer from severe headaches which at times again left him bedridden.

5 April 1791. Bligh discovers the island of Tematangi about 500 miles south-east of Tahiti.

8 April 1791. Tahiti is sighted.

About 10 April. The ships anchor in Matavai Bay, Tahiti.
