#### WORLD'S FIRST ELECTRIC TUG FOR AUCKLAND

Ports of Auckland has signed a contract with Dutch company Damen Shipyards to buy the world's first full-size, fully electric port tug.

The new tug, a Damen RSD-E Tug 2513 to be delivered in 2021, will have a 70 tonne bollard pull, the same as the port's strongest diesel tug Hauraki, also built by Damen. "In 2016 we set ourselves the goal of being zero emission by 2040," says Tony Gibson, CEO of Ports of Auckland. "We set this goal because we recognise that urgent action is needed on climate change, and we wanted to be part of the solution. However, setting that goal created a tough challenge. We have a lot of heavy equipment, like tugs, and in 2016 there were no zero emission options."



#### **DID YOU KNOW?**


On 16 August 1963 the last Passing-Out Parade took place at HMNZS Tamaki on Motuihe Island. The establishment then had to be shifted to Narrow Neck during the two-week break before the next intake of 440 trainees, the largest entry ever attempted. The move started the night of the end of term parade, working at the North or South beach on a rising tide so the beach would take the weight of the trucks and depending on the wind direction. Eight Ships Company and two fork-lifts manned the outgoing end and four at the Fort Cautley end.
